Expectations of the Annapolis Pride Board of Directors

As the highest leadership body of the organization and to satisfy its fiduciary duties, the Board is responsible for the following:

- Determining the mission and goals of the organization
- Participating in strategic and organizational planning
- Ensuring strong fiduciary oversight and financial management
- Fundraising and resource development
- Approving and monitoring Annapolis Pride's programs and services
- Enhancing Annapolis Pride's public image
- Assessing its own performance as the governing body
- Creating and maintaining a multicultural and anti-racist organization

Expectations of Individual Board Members of Annapolis Pride

- Know and stay abreast of Annapolis Pride's mission, vision, policies, programs, and needs
- Serve as active advocates and ambassadors for Annapolis Pride
- Leverage connections, networks, and resources to help Annapolis Pride achieve its mission, including fundraising and development
- Enhance the public image of Annapolis Pride
- Prepare for, attend, and conscientiously participate in Annapolis Pride Board meetings
- Participate fully in one or more Annapolis Pride Board committees
- Comply with Annapolis Pride's bylaws, policies, and Board resolutions
- Commit to a three-year Board term, renewable for an additional three years, or a one-year term for the student member
- Respond to requests for information, feedback, or decisions between meetings in a reasonable timely manner
- Maintain confidentiality about all internal matters of Annapolis Pride, and support decisions made by the Board
